



Masterclasses with Breandán de Gallaí

For the first time ever, Breandán de Gallaí – former principal dancer of Riverdance and founder and creative director of Ériu Dance Company – will visit Berlin for a series of masterclasses in both soft- and hard shoe dancing.

Advanced dancers will have the opportunity to explore innovative choreographies of the Ériu Dance Company repertoire. Please read the class description for this opportunity carefully.

About Breandán



Breandán is an enthusiast of many dance genres and in 1988 he graduated from the Gus Giordano Dance Academy, Chicago, having been awarded a scholarship to study Ballet, Modern, Jazz and Tap dance.

As a dancer, Breandán toured with *Riverdance* from 1994 - 2003, 7 of which in the position of principal dancer. He also acted as Dance Director for the company from 2007-2013. He returned to the stage after a 13-year hiatus to perform in his own production *Linger* and has continued to dance in his company work ever since.

As a dance scholar Breandán's interest lies in the contemporisation of Irish dance. He completed a performance-based doctorate in 2013, the first of its kind in the world. He earned an MA in Ethnochoreology in 2009 and was external examiner for the MA in Traditional Irish Dance Performance at the University of Limerick from 2004 - 2008. Breandán has held the positions of Course Director of the Arts Practice PhD programme and the MA Irish Dance Performance at the University of Limerick. He is currently Course Director of the BA and MA in Irish Dance Performance at the university. Breandán also holds a B.Sc. (Hons) in Physics.

About Ériu Dance Company

In his capacity as artist director and choreographer of dance company Ériu, Breandán explores the poetic potential of the Irish dance form and presents work that is explorative and innovative in a contemporary context. He has created several works, most notably The Village, Walls Talk, Salómae, Aon, Linger, Rite of Spring and Noctú. The work has been nominated for several major awards including The Drama Desks (NY), Business to Arts (Ire), and Total Theatre Awards (UK). Breandán is currently developing several new works. Ériu's all male interpretation of Lorca's The House of Bernarda Alba recently premiered at the Galway Theatre Festival in early May 2023. At the R&D stage is an original dance-comedy, Countless Cathleens, and a solo project about loss, grieving, and finding meaning, Decland. Balor which is being created for the youth branch of the company – Na Mic Ua gCorra – and will have its première at the Earagail Arts Festival in 2024.

Class and Level Description

There are three levels of classes to choose from. Below is a guide:

Level I - Beginner to Easy Primary

This level is suitable for dancers who have gained some experience in both soft- and hard shoe dancing. They have already familiarised themselves with the beginner reel, light jig and beginner heavy jig or hornpipe and maybe have already started to explore some more advanced dances, such as the primary reel. The class will focus on strengthening and further developing the dancers fundamental skills and technique with challenging but suitable material for further progress.

Level II - Advanced Primary to Intermediate

This level is suitable for the more advanced dancers with experience with primary and intermediate standard dances. The dancers have a good understanding of timing and rhythm structures and are able to grasp more complex material. The class will focus on advancing the dancer's set of skills to further engage with challenging and more advanced materials.

Level III – Advanced

Advanced dancers are required to have a very good standard in terms of timing, rhythm, and technique and are comfortable dancing open standard, advanced dances both soft and hard shoe. The dancers are able to understand complex and challenging rhythms and footwork. The dancers will be learning material that is of a standard that one would be expected to have mastered to compete at a high level – recalling and placing at qualifiers, and qualifying for the World Championships.

Ériu Dance Company Technique & Repertoire for Advanced Dancers

We are delighted to present the opportunity to advanced dancers to explore the innovative choreographic approach of Breandán de Gallaí by learning some of the iconic pieces from Ériu Dance Company repertoire. This is an opportunity for aspiring dancers who wish to pursue Irish dance as a profession or would like to explore a more contemporised vision of Irish step dance performance.

Dancers wishing to take part in these classes are required to send a video of their dancing – 16 bars (Right & Left) of a step in Hornpipe/Jig timing in traditional style to traditional Irish music. The dancers will be assessed in terms of their ability, as well as their suitability to engage with the material, and offers extended to candidates in advance of the Masterclass series.

To take part in the Ériu Company Class you need to take part in the masterclasses on Level III.

Please note! Dancers should consider which level they are best suited to, to gain the most benefit from the workshop. If after the first class, Breandán feels that a dancer should change level for the second day, he will advise.

1. The deadline for applications is the 15th of September 2023.
2. Deadline for Early Bird Discount is the 22nd of August 2023.
3. After we received your application form, we will inform you about your Fee that is to be paid within 5 days via bank transfer into our account (Gyula Glaser-Ohnesorge; IBAN: DE67 1001 1001 2626 9528 02; BIC: NTSBDEB1XXX). After we received your Fee, you will receive a Confirmation Email about your successful application.
4. Please note that a confirmed application **can be cancelled at no cost only till the 1st September 2023**. After this date, only 50% of your fee can be refunded.
5. Please note that classes have a maximum capacity of 15 participants. The Ériu Dance Company classes are limited to 10 participants. In case of larger interest, we will create a waiting list, or look for a larger venue, but we cannot guarantee.
6. Single Class Admissions (for example you only would like to apply for 1 class on Saturday) will only be confirmed upon availability after the 15th of September 2023.
